EDITORS COLUMN

This Months Column deals with an aspect of the game which I have noticed becomes more apparent every week in the BSPL - The Throw in. Without fail, players are constantly calling "Foul Throw" when it is clear many do not know what constitutes a "Foul Throw" Below is the text from this years FIFA Laws of the Game which relates to Throw ins.

A goal cannot be scored directly from a throw-in.

A throw-in is awarded: When the whole of the ball passes over the touch line, either on the ground or in the air from the point where it crossed the touch line to the opponents of the player who last touched the ball

Procedure

At the moment of delivering the ball, the thrower:

- · Faces the field of play
- Has part of each foot either on the touch line or on the ground outside the touch line
- · Uses both hands
- Delivers the ball from behind and over his head

The thrower may not touch the ball again until it has touched another player.

The ball is in play immediately it enters the field of play.

It is very simple procedure and I hope that this article can be passed onto players for their information.

HAVE A GURN

Some teams are already not using either the BSPL Matchball which was given to them or a better quality one. Practice Balls such as the cheaper Mitre Calcio etc will not be deemed to be acceptable as Matchballs and clubs using them may be reported for not having a suitable ball available, with the subsequent £5 fine.

All Managers are reminded that full names must be entered on the left hand side of the match card and not an initial (eg. Joe Bloggs and not J. Bloggs) This speeds up administration and prevents mistaken identity in disciplinary matters. A £2.50 fine for all those who do not adhere to the rule.

Finally, as will be discussed in the January meeting, Referees have been instructed to issue yellow cards for the slightest dissent shown to a referee by a player.

They are also under strict instructions to initially warn Mamagers and Coaching staff for any Dissent from the line and send them from the line if Dissent continues. Managers are also reminded of their clubs responsibilities regarding abuse by spectators on their line.

A VIEW FROM THE MIDDLE By Con Fox

The 2004 segment of the Sunday Premier League promises to be one of the best yet. The First Division will be close, but nothing compared to the Second Division which is turning out to be a real cracker. Unfortunately I am duplicating some of the Chairman's

comments elsewhere in this newsletter, but no longer do referees strive to officiate top First Division games. Because of the abuse and stick they receive from certain teams in the top flight, they have indicated their unwillingness to officiate in games involving these teams.

Teams have started not to bring corner flags out at venues, citing the fact that there are none avail-



able. This is not so and if they ask reception or the groundsman, flags will be handed out. I will be informing referees that matches will not commence unless flags are out, and if a team does not have them in position by 1.45pm, they will suffer

the consequences.

The BSPL Committee supplied all teams with a match ball. Whether this, or a better ball is used, it must be inflated properly or referees will report this to the Committee and a £5 matchball fine will be made. So take note.

FIRST DIVISION TROPHY
